The local brothers in Mputu were grateful that Festo and Dario came over to teach about Daniel's life.

They wrote the following report about this visit:

No word can express how much thankful we are to the Lord for the good and blessed time we had together during the three days boys' youth camp.

Prior to the camp, we had Bible studies about the life and ministry of Daniel with young brothers, who would help with discussions in groups of more or less a dozen participants.

These studies > proved to be very good preparation for their task during the youth camp. They did a blessed job in guiding group discussions. Indeed, after each lesson, participants were divided into groups to find answers to the questions in the brochure about Daniel. Their answers were then discussed together, which was very instructive.

These young brothers also supervised the dormitories and carried out useful practical work.

By the Lord's help we were able to finish the first part of our studies about the life of Daniel (Maisha ya Danieli - Sehemu ya 1). Daniel and his friends stood for the interests of the Lord despite

Youth camp in the Bible Centre in Nyamata, Rwanda, from 29th – 31th December 2023

Once again, the Kigali assembly organised a youth camp at the end of 2023. We were also blessed to have among us brother Daniel Naef from Switzerland, who has in his heart a burning desire to make these visits again, as far as the Lord will allow, to help the young people of our assemblies in Rwanda and to visit local assemblies. During this visit he went seeing brothers and sisters of Matimba and Kirehe, encouraging them through the Word.



Already in the end-of-year holidays, the young people, girls and boys, responded to this invitation to be together around the Word for three days at the Bible Center in Nyamata: from 29 to 31 December 2023. Having the strong desire to bring together young people from assemblies in the region, we again invited young people from Uganda, of whom twelve young people from Mukono, and ten young people from Kasese joined us. We were very thankful that also two young people from DR Congo (Bukavu), and one young person from Bujumbura in Burundi were able to come. A total of 25 young people from neighboring countries, together with about sixty young people from assemblies of Rwanda, gathered in the Nyamata premises for this camp, along with their supervisors.

The subject was the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 1 to 6. Before beginning the study of the Word of God, there was a group of young people who declared that they were not saved and we had a separate talk with them before joining the others for the rest of the session. It was encouraging to hear their statement at the end of the talk.



The study began with being occupied with the glorified Lord who gave the Holy Spirit to dwell in the believers as witnesses of the risen Lord. As soon as the assembly was formed, the believers were characterized by their way of life as we see in the gathered assembly in Acts 2:42. This highlighted their mission because they were proclaiming to the world that Jesus, the Holy One of God, had been crucified but had also risen and glorified and lives forever.

However, the devil becomes active where the Lord acts and saves souls through the preaching of the gospel. This is the reason for the persecution we see in chapter four. Prayer was a great support through the

persecution they endured. They were not asking the Lord to take it away from them, but rather needed the strength to endure. And without delay, God answers their prayers by giving them the boldness to proclaim the Word of God (4:31).



The sin of Ananias and Sapphira was highlighted in chapter 5: the lie against the Holy Spirit and its terrible consequences. The believer is made righteous by the work of the Lord. The Holy Spirit lives within him and probes his whole being: how could he dare to lie to the One who knows him beyond what he can know? And how can I live in communion with the Lord who knows me so well? I must surrender myself to Him so that He can act in me with complete liberty.

After this negative behaviour of Ananias and Sapphira, in chapter 6 we see murmuring among the believers: a manifestation of jealousy and selfishness that are contrary to the Christian witness before the world.

We never cease to give thanks for the tranquillity, mutual bond and exchange that characterized this camp for young people from different horizons. Glory be to the Lord that we did not lack anything materially for the smooth running of this camp.

Youth meetings, including with sponsored children and visits during visit of sister Ellen Meijnen to Rwanda from January 2^d - 9th , 2024

Since Tuesday 02 January 2024, in Rwanda, we have had the joy of welcoming our sister Ellen Meijnen and her nephew Peter Benaja Meijnen from the Netherlands for an 8-day visit. As planned in their visit programme, in the early hours of 03 January we set off by bus for the Kamembe region in western Rwanda, where we were due to visit the Shangi-Rurenge local assembly and the Kamembe town assembly.

After more than 7 hours of bus travel before arriving in the town of Kamembe, we arrived on the small road that leads to Shangi and we had to travel about ten kilometres by motorbike on slippery roads. When we arrived in Shangi, we were welcomed in the house of our sister Colette (widow of Brother Nicolas who has been with the Lord since 2009). The whole assembly was there to welcome us at around 4:30 in the evening, in a warm atmosphere and in brotherly communion between the local brothers and sisters and our visitors.

The conversations continued with the presentation of our visitors, and then our sisters also made their presentation, based mainly on their family situation and

the testimony of the strength that the Lord provides them to follow him, helping them to guide the children. Their husbands have left them in the fear and pursuit of the way of the Lord. We then shared the good meal that had been prepared for us and we all spent the night in the house that welcomed us.

On the morning of 04 January, we set off from Shangi to take the main road back to Kamembe. It took us about 30 minutes by bus to get to Kamembe on the main Kigali-Kamembe-Bukavu road (DRC). In Kamembe, the brothers and sisters had prepared to welcome us in the meeting room at the Bible Centre where they had also prepared their first prayer meeting of the year 2024. The meeting began at 10.30 am and lasted until 12 noon.

At the end of the meeting, all the children who had already found sponsors had the opportunity to write them short letters of greeting. These letters will be accompanied by small photos taken and printed on the spot using a small printer that our visitors had at their disposal. We hope that these letters will please our dear sponsors, whom we never cease to thank for their donations to help children from poor families go to school.
